

Dear Parent(s) and/or Guardian(s):

British Columbia has a redesigned curriculum which affords us an opportunity to think about how we assess and report on student progress. In Saanich, our goal is to continually improve and to ensure that families are well informed about their children's progress.

This year elementary students in Saanich will receive a report card that looks slightly different than in the past. Teachers in Saanich will be using MyEducation to create report cards. **MyEducationBC** is the repository of information and resources to support students in the Province of British Columbia. The rationale is that My Education report cards are:

- consistent with what students' receive in other districts
- consistent with the report cards students receive in middle and secondary school
- allow us to track how students are progressing over time

In Saanich, we will continue to use the Proficiency Scale to assess student progress. The scale uses the descriptors **Emerging**, **Developing**, **Proficient** and **Extending** as explained below.
